

Business Highlights

National Economy

On a variety of measures the U.S. economy is performing reasonably well. Real gross national product expanded to \$16.3 trillion in the fourth quarter of 2014 from \$15.9 trillion in Q4, 2013, a gain of 2.2 percent. Nonfarm employment grew by 3.1 million, a gain of 2.3 percent, year-over-year in December. While there are been considerable concern about employment growth since the end of the Great Recession in 2009, year-over-year employment growth has averaged 2.4 million since January 2011, and in recent months annual gains have exceeded 3.0 million. While employment growth since the end of the recession has been anemic in comparison to prior recessions, and problems still appear with considerable numbers of workers who are working part-time, but would like to work full-time, the recent gains in job growth are encouraging.

The unemployment rate has fallen from 6.6 to 5.7 percent this past year, a sizable decline. Industrial production rose substantially in 2014, rising from an index value of 101.3 to 106.2, a gain of 4.8 percent. In spite of this generally favorable news about the national economy, inflation remains very low. Indeed, from year ago levels, inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index fell slightly in December 2014 from year ago levels. What is known as the GDP Implicit Price Deflator, a broader measure of economy-wide inflation, was up only 1.2 percent. Interest rates remain quite low, partly in response to low inflation and, of course, Federal Reserve increases in the money supply. The six-month Treasury bill rate is only 0.08 percent and even the 10-year Treasury bond is hovering just above 2.0 percent.

It is approaching six years since the end of the Great Recession that lasted from December 2007 to June 2009. And, in that the average time between recessions is five years, many commentators are worrying about a recession in 2015 or 2016. The scorecard of economists in forecasting recessions is not enviable. In general, recessions, even the deep recession of 2007-2009, are not well foreseen.


There have been some advances in recent years that

potentially enable us to see into the future with greater accuracy. Leading economic indicators has been one such approach, and the Conference Board produces such an index that has proven to be of some value. However, attention has been focused in recent years on the Chicago Federal Reserves National Activity Index (CFNAI). This index is a compilation of 85 variables that are indicative of performance of the US economy, and offer some foreshadowing of the economic future. Figure A presents a graphic of this measure.

Note that at the start of the Great Recession, the CFNAI was registering about a -0.67 reading, basis the three-month moving average that tends to "smooth out" the measure. (The shaded bars represent periods of recession.) The index dropped fully to -4.0 before recovery. Note, also, that there are many examples of "false negatives," that is, times when the index is weak, but a recession doesn't follow. And, it is not impossible, as was the case in the 1970s, for recessions to quickly occur despite recent positive readings. Still there is some comfort in the CFNAI being presently above the zero mark at +0.67. Thus, the likelihood of a recession unfolding in the immediate future appears small.

While many indicators for the national economy are signaling that economic growth will continue at modest rates, the Federal Reserve Board of Governors has ended quantitative easing and this increases the necessity of remaining vigilant about the future course of key economic variables. The Fed appears to be bracing financial markets for a time soon to come, say within six months, when the Board will begin raising interest rates. This is a very different world from what financial markets have faced in the last six years. In those years, the Fed has expanded its balance sheet by over \$3.5 trillion, purchasing both federal government bonds and mortgage-backed issues, thus, keeping interest rates low.

Financial markets still expect that the Fed "has its back." And, it is likely the case that the Fed will "come to the rescue" once again if problems develop, which it has done repeatedly since the Greenspan era. Thus, the prospects for continuing, but unexceptional, growth, is the likely course for the immediate future.



Oklahoma Economy

The Oklahoma economy continues to perform in line with the national economy. Indeed, state wide employment growth was 2.2 percent, year-over-year, in December 2014 in comparison to national employment growth of 2.3 percent. Oklahoma City grew even faster at 3.0 percent.

Examination of Figure B, comparing year-over-year employment growth rates for the nation, Oklahoma, Oklahoma City, and Tulsa metro areas, is very illustrative of differing circumstances that Oklahoma faces today in relation to the national economy. The trend has been, since the late 1980's, for Oklahoma growth rates to be in alignment with growth of the national economy. There is, of course, variation. Oklahoma and its major metro areas sometimes grow faster, sometimes more slowly than the national economy, but the variation is small and our experience definitely "rhymes" with the national experience.

This is important in that what these trends since the late 1980's reveal is that Oklahoma has a more diverse economy. This certainly was not the case in the late 1970's and 1980's when the state's economy was very much dependent upon the energy boom for its growth prospects. At times during the late 1970's and early 1980's, Oklahoma's employment growth was four to five percentage points higher than the nation. With collapse of the energy boom, at times when one in 12 workers in Oklahoma was directly employed in the energy sector, our growth rates were four to six percentage points lower than the nation's. This pattern continued for much of the 1980's.

In 1989, the "rhyming" of Oklahoma growth rates with the nation began and continues to this day. This is important for many reasons, but especially in relation to the recent decline in oil prices and very inexpensive natural gas. West Texas Intermediate Crude Oil prices have fallen from the \$105 level to about \$43 and are currently about \$50. Of course, there are concerns there will be considerable declines in employment in Oklahoma in consequence of the deterioration in energy prices.

To "get a handle" on what the ultimate "worst case" might be for Oklahoma as a consequence of weak energy prices, consider Figure C. This graphic shows that mining sector employment, dominated as it is by oil and gas exploration and production, rose from about 40,000 to

60,000 since the Great Recession in consequence of high energy prices. The "fracking" boom is largely responsible for these recent gains. "Support Activities" as shown in the graphic is largely the source of these employment gains. Indeed, the Oil and Gas Extraction industry (NAICS 213) gained only about 6,000 jobs since the end of the recession on a base of 18,500 jobs. Support activities increased by about 14,000 and are jobs related to the actual drilling and servicing of well sites. The remaining jobs in NAICS 213 are more associated with corporate headquarters jobs, which are likely to be less affected by the decline in prices, as the graphic reveals. Less affected, of course, does not mean unaffected.

Of course, there are multiplier effects of employment in such an important "export" sector of the Oklahoma economy. Employment multipliers as high as 2.5 are fairly rare, but let's assume as an exercise that the employment multiplier for this industry is 3.0. This would mean that there are two jobs supported in Oklahoma for each job generated directly by the mining sector. If oil prices do not recover quickly and even slide to the \$40 level for oil, we could see direct employment recede by roughly 20,000 workers, leading to a total employment impact of 60,000 workers overall for the Oklahoma economy. That would be a tremendous blow, not to be made light of. Such a slide in employment would represent almost two years of total employment growth achieved in recent years.

Such an outcome, the loss of 60,000 total jobs, is just about the worst we can expect and is based on \$40 oil that occurred in the Great Recession as well as an outsized employment multiplier. Clearly, this slide in oil prices is not a welcome event for Oklahoma. There are many economists who believe that lower energy prices will stimulate consumer demand. Thus, given Oklahoma's increased economic diversity, the state could receive growth impulses indirectly from lower energy prices. It is a fact that the Oklahoma economy is more diversified. Only one in 28 workers is directly employed in the energy sector today, versus one in 12 at the height of the energy boom in the 1980s. We can hope that that diversification, together with recovering energy prices, will keep Oklahoma on a growth path.


